Remembrances of my Grandpa Peters:

I remember Grandpa Peters as a boy between eight and ten years of age when we visited at the family home at 2236 St. Louis Ave. and at the "dry goods store" located at 14th and Warren.

Grandpa was then near eighty, but frequently went down to the store to serve as cashier. Occupying a desk on a raised plat= form in the center of the dry goods department. He was somewhat stern and formal in manner and always wore a plain dark suit with a prominent gold watch chain. I went to the store with my Mother, while she did some buying I stayed with grandpa at the desk.

Grandpa's house seemed to be the place for visiting ministers and missionaries to visit, and I remember Mr. Steffens the president of Dubuque University.
