

Baggerman Files For State Senate

As expected, Second Ward St. Charles city councilman William Baggerman has filed as a Republican candidate for the state senate from the Second District. The newly organized district include parts of St. Charles County and St. Louis Counties.

Redistricting from 1970 places the majority of the district voters in St. Charles.

Baggerman last month announced he would not seek reelection to the city council. "I feel there is a certain length of time that a person should serve in a position," Baggerman said in announcing his intent not to seek reelection. He has been on the council for eight years.

During the last six

years on the council, Baggerman has headed the Ordinance and Printing Committee.

It's his second entry into state politics. In 1962, he ran unsuccessfully for the Republican nomination to the state senate from the old 20th District. One of four candidates, Baggerman finished second to Senator Don Owens.

However, Baggerman did collect more votes from St. Charles County than the combined total of the three candidates finishing behind him.

Baggerman is stressing a low cost, high key campaign. "It will be my policy," said Baggerman, "not to accept more than \$25 from any one person or organization. I plan to run a do-it-myself campaign, depending upon a lot of walking and the help of my wife Jean and our five children."

Baggerman, who lives at 20 Briarwood, has served on federal and state volunteer committees. He is a member of the Governor's Advisory Council on Aging and the St. Louis District Advisory Council of the Small Business Administration.

City Councilman William Baggerman of St. Charles has filed as a Republican candidate for state senator in the Second State Senatorial District.

In his campaign, Baggerman said he will stress the importance of public trust in public officials and stated, "I think heavy campaign spending is usually where the trouble starts. It will be my policy not to accept more than \$25 from any one person or organization. I plan to run a do-it-myself campaign, depending upon a lot of walking and the help of my wife Jean and our five children."

Baggerman will complete his fourth term on the St. Charles City Council in April. For six years, he was chairman of the Ordinance and Printing Commit-



of four Republican candidates in the old 20th State Senatorial District. He received more votes in St. Charles County than the combined vote for the other three candidates, however finished second to Senator Don Owens later elected in the general election.

In November, Baggerman was appointed by Gov. Christopher S. Bond to the Governor's Advisory Council on Aging and last July was re-appointed by the Washington, D. C. office of the Small Business Administration to a second term as a member of the St. Louis District Advisory Council of the S.B.A.

The Baggerman family lives at 20 Briarwood, St. Charles, having previously been residents of Augusta.

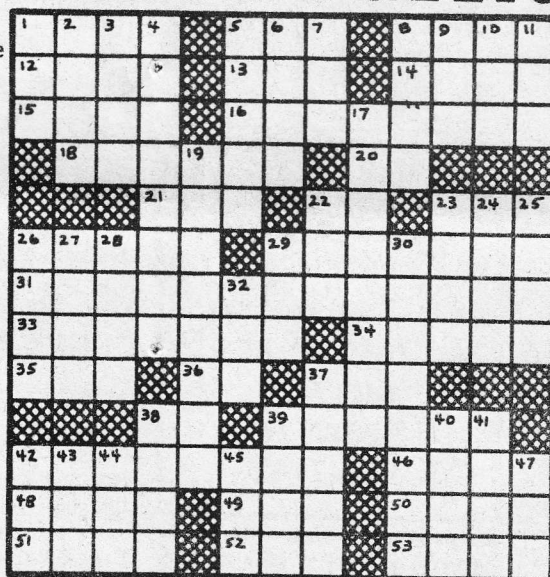
